VICTOR MODEL CONN CORNETS

Eminent Soloist and Bandmaster Tells How He Began His Career with a Conn.


One of the most powerful tributes to the merits of the Victor model cornet made by C. G. Conn, Ltd., Elkhart, Ind., was recently voiced by Bohumir Kryl, the widely known cornet soloist and bandmaster, who makes his home in Chicago:

"Throughout my many years in musical work I have had occasion to see, hear and try most all makes of instruments. Before starting on my career as a cornet soloist, I looked about most carefully in my selection of a cornet that would and could give me the playing qualities most desired for my engagements. Naturally, my choice fell on the Conn. I have seen the Conn factories grow from a small shop to their present large proportions, and I have followed each of their models of cornets, one by one, finding that each new model easily surpassed the former.

The present model, the Victor, has given me a surprise, as it has all other cornetists of my acquaintance, in that it has extended the register of playing more easily on the upper part of the scale by a half octave, and it has not lost any of the fullness or richness of the middle and lower register. Aside from this, it possesses a richer and fuller tone throughout the scale, plays far more easily, and is unquestionably a much greater cornet than any of the other of the Conn models. This is a wonderful achievement on the part of the Conn factory, and the one who designed this cornet is worthy of the highest congratulations and gratitude of all cornetists of today."

OWNS FAMOUS BAGPIPES.

Hughie J. Mack, the comedian, has what he considers the most famous set of Irish bagpipes in the United States. Mack received the pipes from the Musical Society of Dublin. Mack is a bagpipe player of note and wherever he appears on the Keith circuit the Gennett record of his bagpiping (No. 5487) is in great demand in the music stores.



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
